AN EDUCATIONAL CENTRE

INTRODUCTION

Viara Junior Academy was started by Violet Anyoso in January 2005 as an educational centre for school going children and day care for working parents. It is registered under the Ministry of Gender, Sports, Culture and Social Services. This certificate allows school to engage in any activity that is beneficial to the community.

Violet died in May 2011 at the age of 34.

The school is sited in Nairobi Huruma with a total of 160 children's running from baby class to standard six at the age of 2½ years to 14 years. About three quarters of the children are vulnerable due to the poverty level within the community. Even the working parents often cannot meet their basic needs such as school fees. Most of these children cannot join the government schools since they cannot meet the requirements such as uniform, tuition fees and desks. Approximately one third of the children living around our school do not attend school because they are orphaned and or their poverty level.



The Academy staff consists of eight teachers and one

support. Their monthly salary ranges from KES 2,500 to 4,500 monthly. It is the teacher dedication and faith in the school that has allowed it to remain open but they need more recognition financially for the time and effort invested.

SCHOOL FEES

Each child is charged KES 1,400 to 1,600 per term which covers 3 months, or KES 4,800 per year for nine months. About 75% of the children are not in the position to pay this due to difficult conditions they are facing. This makes it difficult to run the school since we depend on this amount for rent and teachers' salaries.
